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## Rationale

The GLO project has been devised in order to complement existing options for exchange which encourage and facilitate students in studying overseas. Unlike traditional modes of study abroad, GLO introduces students to cross-cultural academic learning opportunities through the medium of the internet and other ICT.

## Communication methods

Typically, some of the internet and ICT tools which can be used include:

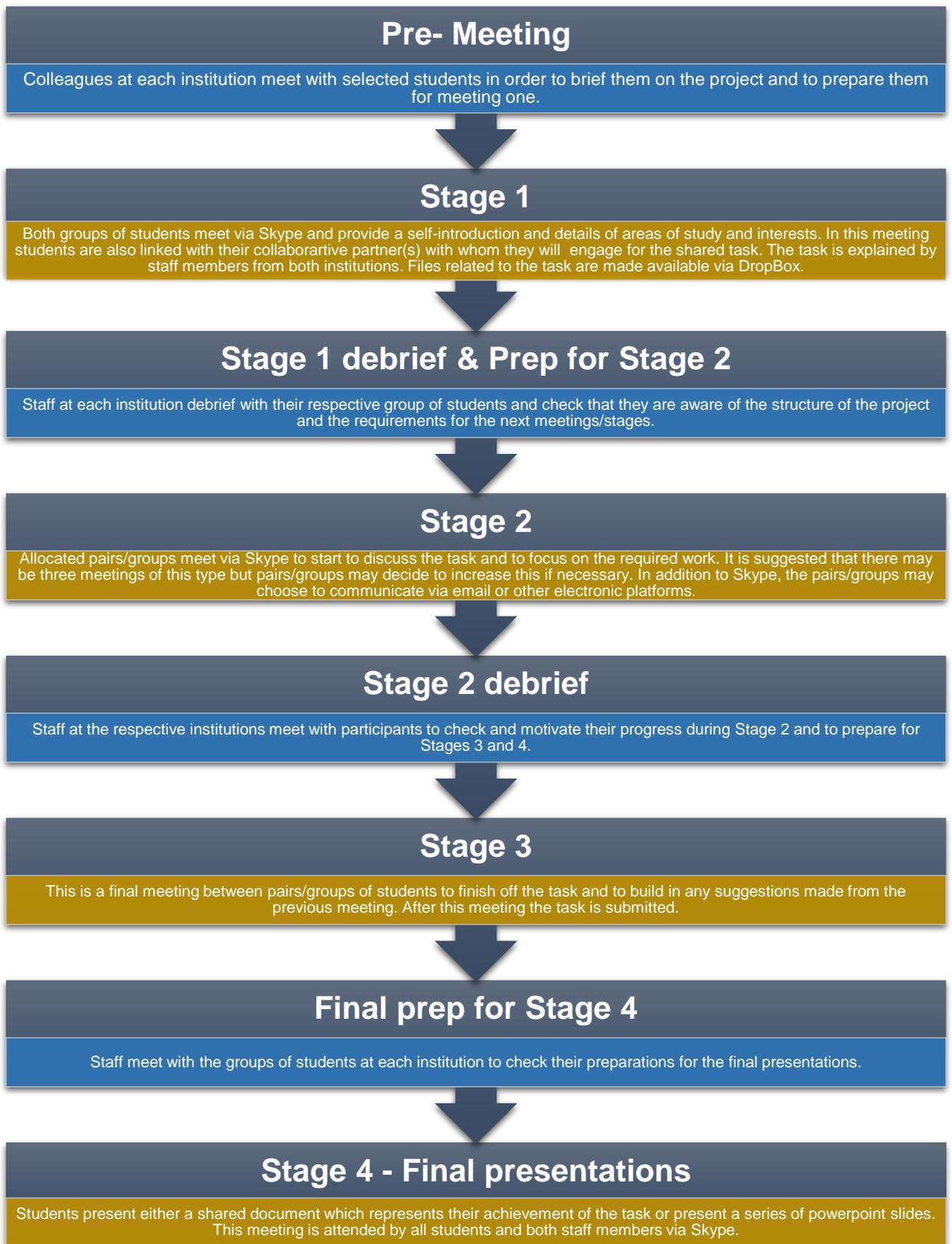
- **Skype**- for video discussion or meeting
- **Dropbox**- for file sharing
- **Word and PowerPoint**- for document creation and presentation building
- **Email or messaging apps**- for discussing aspects of the task

## Project features

In order for a GLO project to be successful it is thought that the following features will need to be incorporated:

- The project should involve an activity which is engaged with by a group of at least five Kent students who are following the same or similar programme of study
- Counterpart students studying the same subject area, or with relevant shared interests, should be identified to participate at one of Kent's existing partner institutions.
- The task should be focused on a shared area of academic practice or interest pertaining to the participating students in both institutions.
- The task should be jointly devised or approved by colleagues from both institutions.
- The project should be devised and centred on a series of clearly devised learning outcomes which are demonstrated in the completion of a shared task, completed jointly by students, at least one from each institution.
- The task should be structured with key stages and a fixed deadline.
- Both groups will be guided by at least one University staff member at each institution.
- A number of meetings should be held during the interaction, a framework for which is provided on the next page:

# GLOBAL LEARNING ONLINE (GLO): MIGRATION

### Participants:

5-10 Undergraduate students at the University of Kent and 5-10 Undergraduate students studying at Hong Kong Baptist University (HKBU)



### Task:

Identify ways in which migration has impacted on your local city and environment. Consider both cultural and economic consequences and the different ways in which people are affected. Devise a series of recommendations which leaders in your region could implement in order to maximise possible benefits from migration in future.

You will need to work in pairs in order to research and deliver a joint 10-minute multi-media presentation of your recommendations. This presentation should be delivered to a group of students from both institutions via Skype at a scheduled final session, which will also be attended by staff from both universities. During the presentations, time and content will be equally divided between each student from the two institutions. In each pair, the student from HKBU will need to present on the recommendations identified by their student partner from Kent and the Kent students will need to present on the recommendations as identified by their student partner from HKBU.

### Learning outcomes:

Through completing this task it is intended that you will:

- deepen your understanding and international awareness of an area of study
- gain an insight into how academic problems or tasks can be approached from different cultural perspectives
- discuss areas of learning and alternative cultural norms or expectations through working with students from another country
- use electronic resources to communicate and work collaboratively with students overseas in order to complete a series of tasks and present findings
- enhance students' key skills of time management and organisation
- introduce students to the concept of the international classroom and learning environment
- To develop specific academic and study skills, in particular giving presentations, team and group work
- To enhance and apply your international communication skills in both verbal and written contexts

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
